North Hollywood Grandmother Receives New Wheels on Valentine's Day

Recycled Rides Program donates refurbished vehicle to provide family with reliable transportation


North Hollywood, CA – February 9, 2012 – A local grandmother struggling to make ends meet while raising her two grandsons and battling her own health issues, will enjoy a special Valentine this year when she receives keys and title to a refurbished vehicle donated by Caliber Collision Centers, the Automobile Club of Southern California, and other local businesses as part of a nationwide program called Recycled Rides.

Debra Loyd and her two grandsons, ages 15 and 9, will be presented with a Ford Focus at a special event February 14, 1:00 pm, at Caliber's North Hollywood Center located at 6929 Laurel Canyon Boulevard.

Loyd and her grandsons currently rely on bus transportation to go grocery shopping, attend church and visit doctors. This is particularly difficult because she uses an oxygen tank and a walker. A crossing guard for the City of Los Angeles for 43 years, she had to retire early a few years ago when she was diagnosed with cancer. She has three to four doctors' visits a week, and is continually concerned that due to lengthy bus routes she has to leave her grandsons at home alone for long periods.

Loyd was nominated for the Recycled Rides vehicle by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Los Angeles. Both her grandsons are participants in the organization's programs to provide mentoring for children and teens.

"Reliable transportation is so important and our hope is that this Recycled Rides gift will ease the burden for a loving grandmother who is doing her best, single-handedly, to give her grandsons a safe, secure and stable life," said David Goldstein, Caliber Collision Vice President of Operations.
